As you know, we had planned to present and discuss the results of the Western Indian Ocean pilot at the workshop in Bonn (May 2020), which had to be cancelled. It is not all bad news, however, as the team was able to come to a functional model for the wider Indian Ocean and maritime Asia database after some testing and finetuning! The attached Excel-sheet contains a sample dataset you could use for testing (please do not circulate), but you could also work with data of your own of course. The portal is only accessible with an authorized account, which you will receive by (automatic) e-mail in due course. Please be on the lookout for that e-mail in the coming days.

To discuss these developments and future plans for the database, we are planning to host an online seminar in December. Details will follow soon, but if you already know that you are hindered on certain dates, please let us know so that we can try to plan accordingly.

Last but not least, we would like to congratulate Samantha Sint-Nicolaas, who worked on developing the database model, with starting her PhD earlier this year! We are very glad that she remains involved with the database project, albeit less intensively.
